gold/yellow. We would love you to join us with your children for the


procession and look forward to seeing you there.

Manchester Pupil Parliament – Thursday 22nd June

On 22nd June, schools from the Manchester Pupil Parliament collective will be joining together for the 'Children of Manchester Safeguarding Conference'. This will be an evaluative session through which our Beaver Road Parliamentarians will co-present with their 'parliament



colleagues' from St Mary's, The Willows, St Catherine's and Haverley Hey Schools. Last summer, Manchester Safeguarding Partnership, including representatives from police, health, youth justice and community safety, consulted with the children to create a plan of action to



address some of the challenges and issues around feeling safe, inclusion and mental health. We can't wait to return to talk about the progress we have made and to introduce a new mental health and wellbeing toolkit resource, created by the children. With Manchester Healthy Schools as our vehicle, our resource will be shared with all young people across the city.

In respond to parent and carer feedback from last year, this year Sports Days will take place in Key Stages and the children will compete in their



E-safety: Online Gaming



As part of their #WakeUpWednesday Campaign, <u>National Online</u> <u>Safety</u> (NOS) provide useful one-page guides about online safety. They are designed to empower parents and carers with the information they need to hold informed and age-appropriate

conversations about online safety. Given its popularity with primary age children, despite its PEGI 12 age rating, we have chosen to start by signposting their information sheet on Fortnite. One in four pre-teens report to have played the game, which claims to have 400 million devotees worldwide – around 25 million of whom play it every day.

In the guide, you will find information on a number of potential risks such as compulsive playing, audio chat with other gamers and in-game spending, which we hope you will find useful. Article 22 (refugee children): *If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.*

The 20th June is the World Day Refugee Day. This is an international day designated by the United Nations to honour refugees around the globe and celebrates the strength and courage of people who have been forced to flee their home country to escape conflict or persecution.
